

turned on by watching their wife get made by another woman. But they would not allow their wife to make love to another man. And the wife would not really be keen on seeing her husband with another girl, with a prostitute.

Penthouse: Why do you think we aren't sexually natural human beings? What did it? The Church? The state?

Hollander: Education. Look at the law in some states. Oral sex is out. Sodomy too. A woman can sue her husband if he practices oral sex with her. So, if you're free sexually it makes you a criminal.

Penthouse: The established institutions and older people have always seemed to be down on sex. How do you explain that?

Hollander: Because to them it was a perversion. For example years ago black was bad. Now black is beautiful. A few years ago to be gay or homosexual was something horrible. Now it seems to be in fashion to be AC-DC or to be gay, especially in Europe. Nobody is ashamed to be homosexual anymore—they're even proud of it. Then there are the transsexuals. Guys have operations performed to change them. A great competition to prostitution in New York right now comes from transvestites and transsexuals. There are also minority groups of masochists and sadists.

Penthouse: What about them?

Hollander: Well, masochism and sadism and leather fetishism—that was once bad. But who knows? That's become fashionable, too. I'm a masochist sometimes. That's why I'll say "pick up that rope" or "spank me" or "rape me." It's a balance. Often a masochist is a person who has a dominant position or job. Presidents of companies, TV producers, people that have leading functions.

Penthouse: They have nobody who tells them what to do.

Hollander: Right, and it is the same with me. I had all those girls, and the Johns, and everything I said they did it. So my empire grew but there was nobody to fight with. At that moment you want to become a masochist. And that's why if people say, "how can you be a masochist" or "how can you be a sadist," I always say it depends on how you put your head, you've got to straighten out your head. Masochists usually don't want to have sex. It's humiliation, degradation, they're after. I use that to work out my hate feelings towards men. Sometimes I do hate men. A lot of whores hate men because they have been put down by them. Eventually prostitution will be out. Everybody will be fucking and sucking and swinging around. For free, maybe. Who knows? But, as long as prostitution is flourishing it is a sign that something is wrong in marriage and in the other sexual relationships of human beings.

Penthouse: What's your attitude to the police? You've had experience of the enforcement of anti-sexual laws.

Hollander: I've had my belly full of cops. I mean in a different sense, now. I used to really have my belly full. There is nothing that is as crooked as a cop, sometimes. A

cop who is supposed to defend people, takes advantage of them because he knows he's in a position where he can throw them in jail. And he can also protect them. So an individual who can either be jailed or needs to be protected has to pay the cop. That's why there are so many crooked cops. A cop, to me, is not a person to look up to with respect.

Penthouse: Of course, it's not just the police. It's the nature of the laws, too.

Hollander: Yes, I once read that in Lima four kids were put in the electric chair because they raped an actress. I think this is ridiculous. Rape might be a very bad act but murderers only go to jail for two or three years.

Penthouse: Do you think that some people are ashamed to let anyone know how ignorant they are about sex, because everybody is supposed to be hip?

Hollander: They're hip in groups but in bed they're not hip. And they're also



afraid. There are so many women in their thirties and forties, the typical Jewish-American princess types, women who have everything materially, but who are insecure, and bored stiff. Their fur coats and the diamond rings are the emblems of insecurity. They say: "Listen John, give me the Cadillac or you don't love me." Someone asked me: "When does a woman become a prostitute?" I think a woman can be a prostitute when she exchanges her body for something material. A housewife can be a bigger prostitute than a hooker because she rejects her husband's desires with "Oh, I've got a headache." But when she sees that fur coat or the diamond ring or the car, she comes across. I saw a young good-looking 29-year-old man at Detroit College who had never cheated on his wife, and he was married seven years. She was blackmailing him every step of the way. He said: "My wife is a negative hooker. If she does it she does

it lousy and she does it five or six times a year and it costs me 10,000, 20,000 dollars. So I think I'm better off paying you 100 dollars."

Penthouse: What about young people and sex, are they pretending that they know about it, pretending that they are liberated, or are they really more free?

Hollander: They are a lot more liberated than the previous generation. I can see that they are. But it's still in a square way. Young kids like to prove themselves by showing how often they can make it but they don't really know how to turn a partner on. The same with young girls.

Penthouse: You think even kids should try all kinds of sex?

Hollander: I would certainly advise college kids not to marry the first girl they meet at high school and then go to college and have babies while they're still students. That's stupid. I think that kids nowadays should go to Europe, travel around a couple of months, and make love to other girls and boys. Let them see some of the world.

Penthouse: So far you haven't mentioned lesbian sex. Don't most prostitutes have lesbian experiences?

Hollander: Of course. It's almost an occupational hazard, because a lot of men who come to a house are bored with straight sex and the more common variations, and they want to have two or three girls at a time. That often ends up with wanting to watch two girls make it. At first some of the girls are uptight about it, because they've never gone down on another woman, but after a few times they start digging it.

Penthouse: Did you ever get lesbian customers?

Hollander: No, the only time women came to me was when their husbands called up for a girl for the two of them. But after they read my book a lot of girls said to me: "My god, now I know what's wrong with me—I'm a lesbian. I never dared express my desires, but there's nothing wrong with being a lesbian or heterosexual or bisexual." At a lecture once I was talking to college kids about oral sex, and a young kid interrupted: "What's wrong with good old-fashioned fucking?" I said: "What's wrong with it is that it is old-fashioned. You should try oral sex. You might like it."

Penthouse: Did the audience applaud?

Hollander: Of course. I wouldn't use four-letter words, but I would really give it to them. I noticed that half the audience was Jewish. And I'm half Jewish. So I concentrated on them and talked about the Jewish-American princesses, the emasculators. The biggest freaks were the Jewish guys who came to me, especially the psychiatrists.

Penthouse: Is there anyone more uninformed about sex than a psychiatrist?

Hollander: Maybe a priest. My father used to be a psychiatrist, originally, but he just gave it up and became an internist. He got so many problems in his head from all those people. He got so involved. If you're a good doctor you'll get involved with the

problems of the patient.

Penthouse: Let's get back to lesbian sex. Your message is that you can't find out until you do it?

Hollander: Right. By being a lesbian, I know how to please a woman almost more than a man would know. By being a voyeur I can enjoy looking at other people, watching their activities or listening to other people and enjoying it, as well as being an exhibitionist, I know how it is for them to look at me. So you should try everything once: homosexuality, heterosexuality, masochism, sadism. People say, how in hell can you enjoy it if somebody spans you? I have tried it and I like it. I don't like too much pain but if it is very sexy it is stimulating. But I am afraid to fool around too much with people that are sadistic to me—once I was beaten up and wound up in a hospital. But sometimes my boyfriend, who is a very peaceful man, bores me stiff. I'm very aggressive. Once I told him: "God damn it, get that rope and tie me down, spank my ass and rape me." Every woman would love to be raped, just once, I mean without getting kicked black and blue, but just be forced to fuck a guy.

Penthouse: In your book you also describe a sexual relationship of sorts with a dog, which gives you a kind of 360-degree sexuality.

Hollander: People think I'm a nymphomaniac. I'm not.

Penthouse: You are what is technically called an erotomaniac, which is not a nymphomaniac but a highly erotic person.

Hollander: Right.

Penthouse: What sparked your interlude with animals?

Hollander: I remember as a child the grocery man used to come by with a horse and carriage. It was a male horse and in peeing its penis would grow almost to the floor. This would turn me on, and I was not the only one because all the other little girls used to peep—"look what's happening, it's growing again." Of course I was a child of six or seven years old, but that idea stayed in my mind. When I grew older I somehow got intrigued by seeing two dogs at it in the street—it was just a sexual fantasy. When the thing happened, not with my sister's dog but another one I've had experience with, and I had done what I always wanted to do, I was cured. I must say it was a painful experience and an uncontrollable experience, because it was a Great Dane, but at least I got rid of my sexual fantasies.

Penthouse: In the two and a half years you were a prostitute, did you ever have the experience of paying either a man or a woman?

Hollander: Not directly, but I helped maybe three young boys—18 or 19 years old—that I really liked. There was one incident with one of my own girls, a beautiful, tall South American redhead, but it was accidental. With three other girls we'd gone to the house of three young stockbrokers who paid \$100 a time. Pat, the girl's name, and I were just sort of sitting

waiting and I had always liked Pat and had made love with her quite a few times in my house. She really turned me on because she's got a beautiful body and a fantastic clitoris the size of my little finger, almost like a man's penis. So I decided to go down on her and it was absolutely fantastic. After she'd been with the customer and it came to paying she said: "Look, this is \$100 for the customer and \$100 for you. I charge you two times 50." I said: "You must be out of your mind." "No," she said, "you make me come twice, you've used my body twice." So I said OK but it was like a slap in the face. She never got any business from me any more, and finally she apologized.

Penthouse: Is your own fantasy life masochistic or sadistic?

Hollander: Sadistic, definitely. I can really freak out when I play the master. Men tend to be selfish and there were times when I hated them. But I also felt sorry for them



because the masochists had no other sexual outlet. There are very few good masters, women who can handle slaves.

Penthouse: What else about your fantasy life?

Hollander: Once a man with a marvelous French accent called me up, and just talking to him for 45 minutes I developed a fantasy about what he'd be like and how we'd make love in every possible way. I don't usually like masturbation but this time I used my fingers and a vibrator and I came four times.

Penthouse: Then did you meet him?

Hollander: No, he said we might be disillusioned. It was beautiful. Nothing like it ever happened again.

Penthouse: You give the impression of being a giver rather than a taker in sex.

Hollander: It's an ego trip, actually. With girls I'm what you'd call butch and I don't usually like them to go down on me. I get more satisfaction from making them

come. With men it's more give-and-take because they're better at stimulating a woman. The height of pleasure for me is to be with a man who knows how to find the clitoris, and to feel his penis grow in my mouth, to feel his balls when he's about to explode. Women are more affectionate, but physically I like to suck a cock.

Penthouse: Did you ever have competition from housewives and Park Avenue girls who wanted to see what it was like to be a prostitute?

Hollander: I had housewives from the suburbs who worked for me part-time. Other housewives who read my book told me they got "so turned on to this whole scene." There are a lot of bored married women. Did you see that movie *Belle de Jour*? Catherine Deneuve played a housewife who was a lousy lay, as a wife, but turned out to be a great prostitute, because it turned her on. A lot of women have this taste for the forbidden fruit. I'm all for legalizing bordellos for boys, where boys are prostitutes, not only for homosexuals, but for women, too.

Penthouse: A man in Hamburg did it. He had 1,000 boys apply for jobs. He chose about 40 of them and he opened for business.

Hollander: I think he's right. In that sense I am a woman's liberator. I am not full of paranoia and penis envy and that sort of rot. Sometimes I am rather old-fashioned and square. I've done a lot of crazy things but in my own mind I am obsessive, I'm jealous, yet polygamous. I could love one man and yet I want to be free. And if I found out he was cheating I'd kill him.

Penthouse: In the past three days how many people have you had sex with?

Hollander: I've had three sexual encounters involving four people.

Penthouse: Three sexual encounters in three days.

Hollander: I always say I can't do without a man for about 24 hours. So when the alarm goes off I go hunting.

Penthouse: Would you like to see prostitution legalized?

Hollander: Legalized is a word I am a bit against. Originally I would have said I'm all for legalized prostitution. But I've talked to some Germans about prostitution there, where it is legal. But legalized prostitution in Germany is only for low, low-class hookers. They carry around in their passport the stamp of the prostitute. They are condemned because of that stamp. I am more for tolerating prostitution if it is done in a quiet way in a private apartment. The moment you get out on the street, like 42nd Street or Lexington Avenue, that kind of prostitution I think should be controlled, as it is in Amsterdam or Hamburg. There should be an area, or some bars, where you'd go with your wife, where you'd know you were going to meet prostitutes. In that sense I'm all for legalizing prostitution.

Penthouse: Do you consider yourself to be out of the prostitution business now?

Hollander: Yes, completely.
