
#### **Introduction:**

The Ballad of the Unbeatable Hearts is another of Richard Fry's breakneck full-force one-man verse dramas all wrapped up in a big woolly jumper. This time he is talking about *young gay suicide*. 

- Do we treat those with disabilities differently?

- What if your son or daughter brought home a girlfriend of boyfriend in a wheelchair?
- Could you fall in love with someone less able yourself?
